Erie Mural Tour

A.) Perry 200 Commemoration Mural | Michael Hinman, 2013

Funded by the Perry 200 Commemoration Commission, this polytab mural illustrates the construction of the Brig Niagara warship for the War of 1812.

B.) Floating Women | Heather Hertel, 2016

Created with the help of Erie Mural Arts and The Sailcloth Art Project, this mural promotes a sense of freedom and liberation while expressing weightlessness.

C.) Bridge at 15th & State St. | Eric Grignol, 2005

Designed by Grignol and painted by Braendel Painting, this mural was commissioned by the City of Erie and the Erie Art Museum to beautify the railroad bridge and serve as a welcome to the downtown.

D.) Train Station Wall Mural | Rebecca Signoriello, 2007

Signorelli researched the fashion and history of railroad stations in the 1940s to create this mural commissioned by Logistics Plus.

E.) Bencher's Union Graffiti Murals | Erie Bencher's Union, 2011

Bencher's Union is a group of street artists in the region that were invited to paint this wall by Logistics Plus CEO Jim Berlin. This always-changing graffiti mural covers the wall from Peach Street to Sassafras and the underpasses.

F.) Logistics Plus Peach St. Bridge Mural | Jason Mumford, 2006

Mumford painted this mural at the request of Logistics Plus to brighten up a heavily trafficked pathway in downtown Erie.

G.) Perry Step Art | Todd Scalise, 2014

This artwork was privately funded and created by Scalise during the Perry 200 Commemoration.

H.) Erie Industry Mural | Ehren Knapp, 2016

Funded by the Big Picture, this polytab mural celebrates the city's manufacturing legacy along 12th Street with the American laborer as its centerpiece. The Skinner Engine building was built in 1930 and the Skinner Engine Company was once the largest maker of steam engines in the United States.

I.) Droid Mural | Erie Bencher's Union, 2015

Graffiti artists from the Bencher's Union created the image as part of a live painting activity coordinated by Lavery Brewing and CAT-TV.

J.) YMCA | Todd Scalise, 2014

The YMCA worked with Scalise to create a playful mural representing the essence of the organization: youth development, healthy living, social responsibility and community presence.

K.) Voodoo Brewery | Simone Welsh 2017

Welsh was commissioned by VooDoo Brewery to create an inviting, colorful mural that represents the Voodoo brand of full flavored artisan brews.



Since 2013 the Erie Art Museum has installed over 65 artist-designed bike racks throughout the city and surrounding areas. Community members and local artists submitted designs for the initial stages of the project, ranging from abstract forms to pieces commemorating Erie history. Project partners include: Erie Insurance, Erie Community Foundation, Perry 200 Celebration, Pedal for the Planet (Mercyhurst University), the Erie County Convention Center Authority, Erie Downtown Partnership, Let's Move Outside, Erie Yesterday, Erie County Department of Health, City of Corry, North East Borough. Bike Erie and the City of Erie.

The Big Picture was created in 2014 with seed money from the 2012 Governor's Arts Awards. It is a consortium of organizations (Erie Art Museum, Erie Arts & Culture, the YMCA and Tungsten Creative) motivated by the potential for public art to transform people and spaces in Erie County and enhance the quality of everyday life. The Big Picture aims to provide artists and community organizations with the resources and inspiration to create, support and sustain large-scale murals throughout the community.
